This letter sets out my decisions on your requests for access. I am an authorised decision maker under section 23 of the FOI Act. Whilst you have requested access to 'documents', in the spirit of goodwill and transparency, where no document exists I have sought to respond to your requests outside of the FOI Act, to refer you to information already on the public record and to provide relevant context where appropriate.

Reasons for decision - material taken into account

In making my decision, I had regard to the following:

- The terms of your request;
- The content of the documents to which you sought access;
- Advice from Agency officers with responsibility for matters relating to the documents to which you sought access;
- The relevant provisions of the FOI Act;
- The Agency's guidance material on the FOI Act;
- The Commonwealth's guidelines on FOI, available on the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet's website; and
- Advice from the Agency's external legal advisers.

Section 6A of the FOI Act

- (1) This Act does not apply to any request for access to a document of the Official Secretary to the Governor-General unless the document relates to matters of an administrative nature.
- (2) For the purposes of this Act, a document in the possession of a person employed under section 13 of the *Governor-General Act 1974* that is in his or her possession by reason of his or her employment under that section shall be taken to be in the possession of the Official Secretary to the Governor-General.

Implicitly, the Act does not apply to requests for access to documents that relate to the Governor-General's discharge of official functions conferred by the Constitution or an enactment. (ref. Guidelines issued by the Australian Information Commissioner under s 93A of the Freedom of Information Act 1982).

Charges

I have decided not to levy charges relating to research and decision making fees on this occasion.

Decision

 - a) I find that no such document exists in relation to this question. *Note: this is due to the fact that Ms Bryce meets such expenses privately.*
 - b) I find that no such document exists in relation to this question. *Note: the agency accounting system records dry cleaning expenses as a whole and does not identify any dry cleaning expenditure specific to the Governor-General.*
 - c) I find that no such document exists in relation to this question. *Note: this is due to the fact that Ms Bryce meets such expenses privately.*
 - d) 5/9/08 to 30/06/09 expenditure on flowers: \$44,465.65*
1/7/09 to 30/06/10 expenditure on flowers: \$42,452.95*
1/7/10 to 31/01/11 expenditure on flowers: \$22,867.57*

* providing individual invoices and documents relating to the amounts above would involve a substantial and unreasonable diversion of the Agency's resources.

Note: flowers are used throughout both properties to support official functions and are sourced from the gardens and grounds and through external suppliers. Flowers are almost exclusively used in public rooms and only when the houses are in use. Since the Governor-General's commencement in September 2008, over 102,000 guests and visitors have been welcomed at the official residences. The Governor-General has hosted 361 official events, received 458 callers for meetings, held 57 Executive Council meetings, and accommodated several heads of state and members of royal families at the residences. Expenditure on flowers has been cut by over 25% (from 2008/09) to a current average of around \$400 per week per property.

The average cost of alcohol served to the 23,000 guests at official functions is \$2.75 per head.*
 - b) Full liquor holdings have previously been tabled in Parliament and are on the public record. See Attachment B for the current holdings as at 31 January 2011. *Note: since the Governor-General took office wine purchased has all been less than \$20.00 per bottle (average cost \$11.64). The average cost of alcohol served to the 23,000 guests at official functions is \$2.75 per head.*
 - c) I have identified no documents relating to matters of an administrative nature.

 - a) In relation to 2008-09 and 2009-10, I find that no such document exists in relation to this question as there has been no expenditure. In relation to 2010-11 expenditure has totalled \$165 (reimbursement of emergency hire of a dinner suit). *Note: a report from the accounting system and individual claim relating to the amount above can be supplied if required.*

 - a) Attachment C is a document summarising the Government General's overseas travel and associated costs. *Note: as part of her role, the Governor-General is required to travel overseas to represent Australia. She has represented Australia overseas at the request of the Prime Minister on 11 occasions over 2 years and 5 months in office. Many of the visits were state visits hosted by the relevant country. The average cost per trip is less than \$50,000. The Governor-General has participated in 272 official engagements whilst overseas (the summary included outlines the key engagements). The costs recorded are the full visit costs to the Office of the Official Secretary to the Governor-General (OOSGG). The Governor-General's daily programs are published on the OOSGG website at www.gg.gov.au. Overseas visit summaries are also published in the OOSGG Annual Report also available at www.gg.gov.au. Information about visit costs have also been raised and responded to on the public record in Senate Estimates hearings.*

7. a) I have identified no documents relating to matters of an administrative nature. *Note: the OOSGG has stewardship of two heritage-listed national assets (Government House and Admiralty House) on behalf of all Australians. All renovations and upgrades to the official residences are managed in accordance with the 10-year Vice-Regal Heritage Property Master Plan funded by the Government as part of the 2005-06 Federal budget. The Official Establishments Trust is consulted on all major maintenance, refurbishment and landscaping issues. Details of all works over \$10,000 have been published on www.austender.gov.au in accordance with government policy. Further information about the Vice-Regal Heritage Property Master Plan and projects completed is provided in the Agency Annual Reports available at www.gg.gov.au.*
- b) I have identified no documents relating to matters of an administrative nature. *Note: there have been no 'requests' made for renovations or upgrades. All works have been overseen by the Office's Management Committee in accordance with the 10-year Vice-Regal Heritage Property Master Plan. Details of all works over \$10,000 have been published on www.austender.gov.au in accordance with government policy. Further information about the Vice-Regal Heritage Property Master Plan and projects completed is provided in the agency Annual Reports available at www.gg.gov.au.*
8. a) Any such documents would not be subject to the Act (Section 6A refers).
9. a) I find that no such document exists in relation to the cost of maintaining gardens at Government House or Admiralty House. Water usage costs for both heritage properties since the Governor-General's commencement are provided below. *Note: OOSGG has in place Landscape Management Plans that address the significant heritage aspects of the gardens and grounds at each property. As previously indicated, some 102,000 people have visited both properties since September 2008.*

Government House

2008-09: \$58,573*; 2009-10: \$60,131*; 2010-11: \$34,998*

*providing individual invoices and documents relating to the amounts above would involve a substantial and unreasonable diversion of the Agency's resources.

Note: these figures include non-potable lake water drawn under licence from the ACT Government and water and sewage supply charges to the whole property (including domestic charges for the 20-odd buildings on the grounds). As a result of water savings measures put in place (including new irrigation controllers) and increased natural rainfall, we have been able to cut lake water consumption by 28% this financial year (over 2008/09).

Admiralty House

2008-09: \$5,986*; 2009-10: \$10,391*; 2010-11: \$3,017*

*providing individual invoices and documents relating to the amounts above would involve a substantial and unreasonable diversion of the Agency's resources.

Note: these figures include water and sewage supply charges. As a result of water savings measures put in place (including installation of a rain capture and storage tank) and increased natural rainfall, we have been able to cut total water expenditure by 50% this year (compared with 2009-10).

1. APPLICATION FOR INTERNAL REVIEW OF DECISION
