## **1 Name of determination**

This determination is the *National Medal (Approved Government Organisations) Determination 2013*.

## **2 Commencement**

This determination commences on the day it is published in the *Gazette*.

## **3 Authority**

This determination is made under regulation 4 of the *National Medal Regulations 2011*.

## **4 Revocation**

The *National Medal (Approved Government Organisations) Determination 2011* is revoked.

## **5 Definitions**

- (1) In this determination:

*commencement day* means the day on which this determination commences.

*Regulations* means the *National Medal Regulations 2011*, set out in the Schedule to the Letters Patent dated 20 April 2011 given under the Great Seal of Australia.

- (2) A word that is used in this determination and defined in the Regulations has the same meaning in this determination as it has in the Regulations.

## **6 Determination of approved government organisations**

For regulation 4 of the Regulations, a government organisation mentioned in an item in Schedule 1 is an approved government organisation.

## **7 Approval date of approved government organisations**

The approval date of an approved government organisation is the approval date for the organisation mentioned in Schedule 1.

## **8 Determination of length of eligible service**

For subregulation 18(4) of the Regulations, Schedule 1 sets out for an approved government organisation:

- (a) the date of the first day of service in the organisation that can be counted as eligible service; or
- (b) the period within which service in the organisation can be counted as eligible service.
