# Centenary Medal Regulations 2001

### 1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Centenary Medal Regulations 2001*.

### 2 Definitions

In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:

**Medal** means the Centenary Medal instituted under the Letters Patent establishing these Regulations.

**Register of Awards** means the register maintained under paragraph 8 (2) (a).

**Registrar** means the Registrar of Awards appointed under subregulation 8 (1).

### 3 Award — prescribed list

- (1) The person holding (otherwise than on an acting basis) any of the following offices at any time during the calendar year 2001 shall be awarded the Medal:
  - (a) Governor-General, State Governor, Administrator of the Northern Territory, or Administrator of an External Territory;
  - (b) Prime Minister, Premier or Chief Minister;
  - (c) Chief Justice of the High Court of Australia or the office of Chief Justice or Chief Judge of:
    - (i) the Family Court of Australia; or
    - (ii) the Federal Court of Australia; or
    - (iii) a State Supreme Court; or
    - (iv) the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory or the Northern Territory or the Territory of Norfolk Island;
  - (d) a Presiding Officer of the Commonwealth Parliament, a State Parliament or the Legislature of a Territory;
  - (e) the Leader of the Opposition in the Commonwealth Parliament, a State Parliament or the Legislature of a Territory.

- (2) A person who held an office mentioned in subregulation (1) and who is living on the 100th anniversary of Federation shall be awarded the Medal.
- (3) A person who is an Australian citizen shall be awarded the Medal if the person:
  - (a) was born not later than 31 December 1901; and
  - (b) is living on the 100th anniversary of Federation.

### **4 Award — general list**

- (1) The Medal may be awarded by the Governor-General to a person who is an Australian citizen if the person has made a contribution to the federation of Australia or to Australian society or government.
- (2) The Medal may be awarded by the Governor-General to a person who is not an Australian citizen if the person has made a contribution to the federation of Australia or to Australian society or government.
- (3) An award under this regulation may only be made on the recommendation of the Prime Minister, or a person authorised in writing by the Prime Minister to make a recommendation under this regulation.

### **5 Cancellation and restoration of award**

- (1) The Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Prime Minister or of a member of the Executive Council under summons who is authorised in writing by the Prime Minister to make a recommendation under this regulation, may:
  - (a) cancel an award made to a person under these Regulations; and
  - (b) reinstate an award that has been cancelled.
- (2) If an award is cancelled:
  - (a) the Registrar must note the cancellation in the Register of Awards; and
  - (b) the person must return the Medal to the Registrar.
- (3) If an award is reinstated, the Registrar must:
  - (a) note the reinstatement in the Register of Awards; and
  - (b) return the Medal to the person to whom it was awarded.

### **6 Design of Medal**

The design of the Medal is as determined by the Governor-General.

**7 Wearing of Medal**

The manner in which, and occasions on which, the Medal may be worn are as determined by the Governor-General.

**8 Registrar**

- (1) The Governor-General must appoint a Registrar of Awards.
- (2) The Registrar must maintain:
  - (a) a Register of Awards, containing the name of each person to whom the Medal has been awarded; and
  - (b) such other records, relating to the Medal, as the Governor-General directs.
- (3) The Registrar may alter an entry in the Register of Awards to correct an error in the entry.
