


COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA
POLICE OVERSEAS SERVICE MEDAL REGULATIONS
DECLARATION UNDER REGULATION 3
DETERMINATION UNDER SUBREGULATION 4(2)

I, WILLIAM GEORGE HAYDEN, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Minister for Justice and Consumer Affairs, hereby:

- (a) under regulation 3 of the Police Overseas Service Medal Regulations which are set out in the Schedule to the Letters Patent given on 25 April 1991, declare the period of overseas service with the United Nations Force in Cyprus with effect from 1 May 1964 to be prescribed service for the purposes of those Regulations; and
- (b) under subregulation 4(2) of those Regulations determine that the conditions for the award of the Police Overseas Service Medal in respect of the prescribed service are:
 - (i) the Medal may be awarded to a member of an Australian police force or other persons who rendered service while posted to or serving as a member of the Australian police contingent engaged in the prescribed service for a period of not less than an aggregate of 90 days;
 - (ii) the Medal shall be awarded to members of an Australian police force and other persons qualifying under subparagraph (b)(i) with the Clasp 'CYPRUS';
 - (iii) the Commissioner of the Australian Federal Police may exercise his discretion to deem prescribed service by a member or person under subparagraph (b)(i) above and shall take into account whether the member's or person's service:
 - (A) was terminated owing to death, illness or injury, or other disability due to service; or
 - (B) was terminated for Government or police force reasons.
