

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

AUSTRALIAN BRAVERY DECORATIONS

I, Sir John Robert Kerr, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, having received the approval of Her Majesty The Queen to the designs of the Australian Bravery Decorations, and acting in pursuance of regulation 13 of the Australian Bravery Decorations Regulations, hereby determine as follows:—

1. The Cross of Valour, which is a gold cross ensigned with the Crown of Saint Edward in gold, surmounted by the shield and crest of the Arms of the Commonwealth of Australia and suspended from a riband, 38 millimetres wide, magenta with a blood-red central band, by means of a bar bearing the inscription "For Valour", shall be worn on the left breast on all occasions when full-size orders, decorations and medals are worn.

A miniature of the Cross of Valour, being a replica one-half of the size of the Cross of Valour, suspended from a miniature riband, shall be worn on all occasions when miniatures of orders, decorations and medals are worn.

A lapel badge of the Cross of Valour, being a representation of the Cross, 10 millimetres in diameter, may be worn at any time with civilian dress.

When the riband of the Cross of Valour is worn alone, a representation of the Cross, 5 millimetres in diameter, is attached at the centre of the riband.

The award of a Bar to the Cross of Valour is recorded by a bar attached to the riband and having at its centre a representation of the Cross. When the riband is worn alone, the award of a Bar is indicated by the addition of a further representation of the Cross, 5 millimetres in diameter.

2. The Star of Courage, which is a silver seven-pointed star ensigned with the Crown of Saint Edward in silver, surmounted by the shield and crest of the Arms of the Commonwealth of Australia and suspended from a riband, 32 millimetres wide, blood-red with a magenta central band, by means of a bar bearing the inscription "For Courage", shall be worn on the left breast on all occasions when full-size orders, decorations and medals are worn.

A miniature of the Star of Courage, being a replica one-half of the size of the Star of Courage, suspended from a miniature riband, shall be worn on all occasions when miniatures of orders, decorations and medals are worn.

A lapel badge of the Star of Courage, being a representation, 10 millimetres in diameter, of the Star of Courage may be worn at any time with civilian dress.

When the riband of the Star of Courage is worn alone, a representation of the Star, 5 millimetres in diameter, is attached at the centre of the riband.

The award of a Bar to the Star of Courage is recorded by a bar attached to the riband and having at its centre a representation of the Star. When the riband is worn alone, the award of a Bar is indicated by the addition of a further representation of the Star, 5 millimetres in diameter.

3. The Bravery Medal, which is a bronze medal ensigned with the Crown of Saint Edward in bronze, surmounted by the shield and crest of the Arms of the Commonwealth of Australia and suspended from a riband, 32 millimetres wide and having 15 alternating stripes of blood-red and

magenta, by means of a bar bearing the inscription "For Bravery", shall be worn on the left breast on all occasions when full-size orders, decorations and medals are worn.

A miniature of the Bravery Medal, being a replica one-half of the size of the Medal, suspended from a miniature riband, shall be worn on all occasions when miniatures of orders, decorations and medals are worn.


A lapel badge of the Bravery Medal, being a representation of the Medal, 10 millimetres in diameter, may be worn at any time with civilian dress.

When the riband of the Bravery Medal is worn alone, a representation of the Medal, 5 millimetres in diameter, is attached at the centre of the riband.

The award of a Bar to the Bravery Medal is recorded by a bar attached to the riband and having at its centre a representation of the Medal. When the riband is worn alone, the award of a Bar is indicated by the addition of a further representation of the Medal, 5 millimetres in diameter.

4. The Commendation for Brave Conduct, which is a silver gilt sprig of mimosa, shall be worn on the lapel or on the left breast on all occasions when full-size orders, decorations and medals are worn. When worn with uniform, the Commendation may be worn on the uniform or on a ribbon of the same colour as the uniform.
5. The Cross of Valour, the Star of Courage, the Bravery Medal and the Commendation for Brave Conduct shall be worn in accordance with the Australian Order of Precedence of Honours and Awards as approved from time to time by The Queen.
